




1. SQUARE KNOT: Useful for attaching two rope ends together




1 Cross the blue and red ends



2 Pass the red end through the blue loop




3 Pull the ends to tighten




4 The knot is complete


2. FIGURE EIGHT KNOT: Useful as a stopper at the end of a line or rope




1 Make a loop with an end



2 Now pass the end through it




3 Pull both sides to adjust the knot




4 The finished knot resembles an "8"


3. SLIP KNOT: Useful to create a loop of adjustable size or a stopper. Easily untied by pulling on the rope end.




1 Take a bight of rope




2 Wrap the tag end around the bight



3 Wrap it once more




4 Hold the loop and pull the end to tighten




5 The knot is completed


4. FISHERMAN'S KNOT: A slip knot that joins two ropes together. Can be used to adjust loop size or rope length.




1 Make a loop with the red rope and feed its end into it



2 Make another loop with the blue rope and tuck its end into it



3 Tighten the two individual knots by their tag ends



4 Pull the standing parts to draw the knots close together
